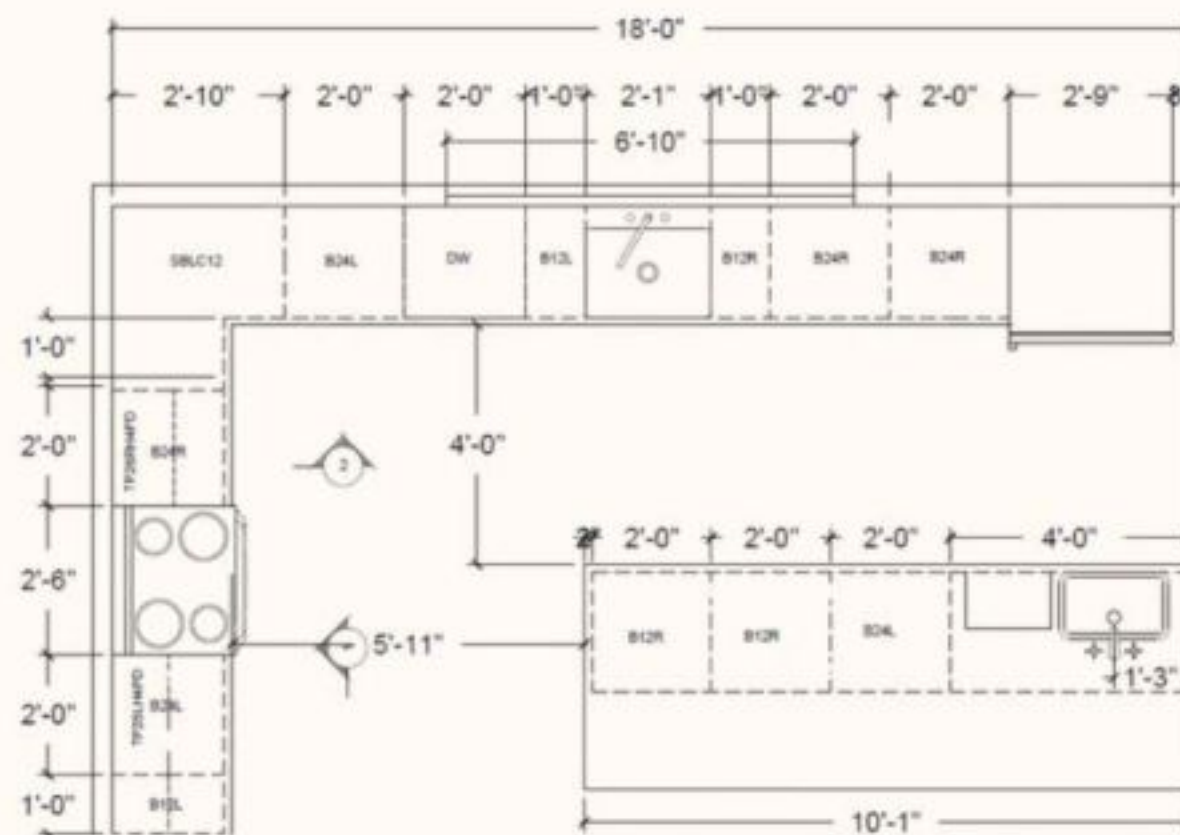

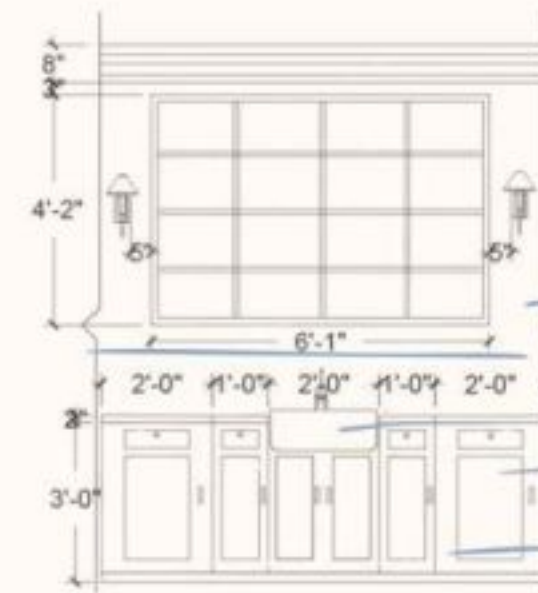
Kitchen Floor Plan - AutoCad

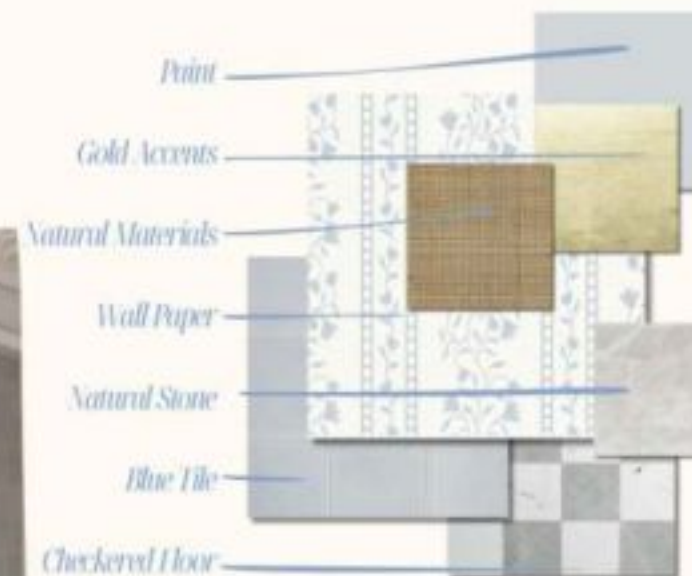

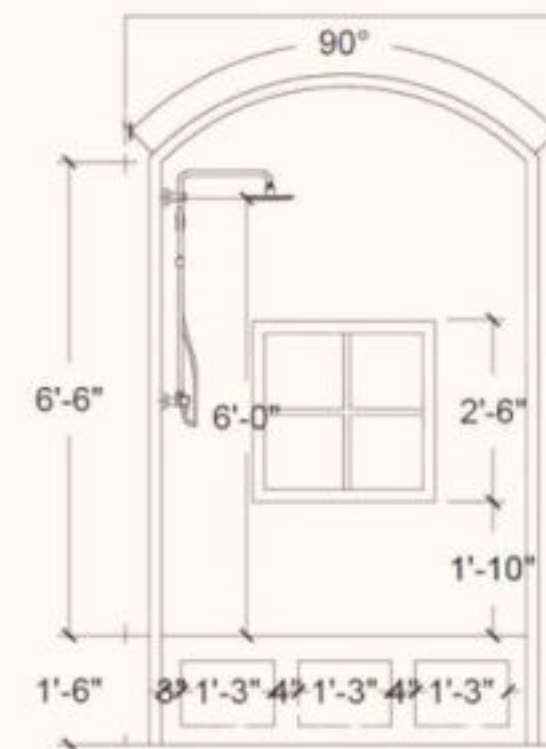

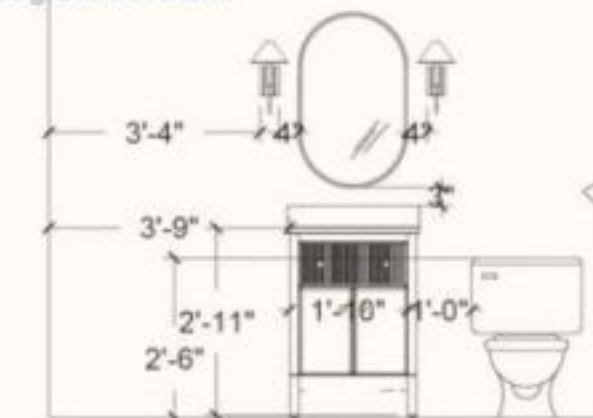

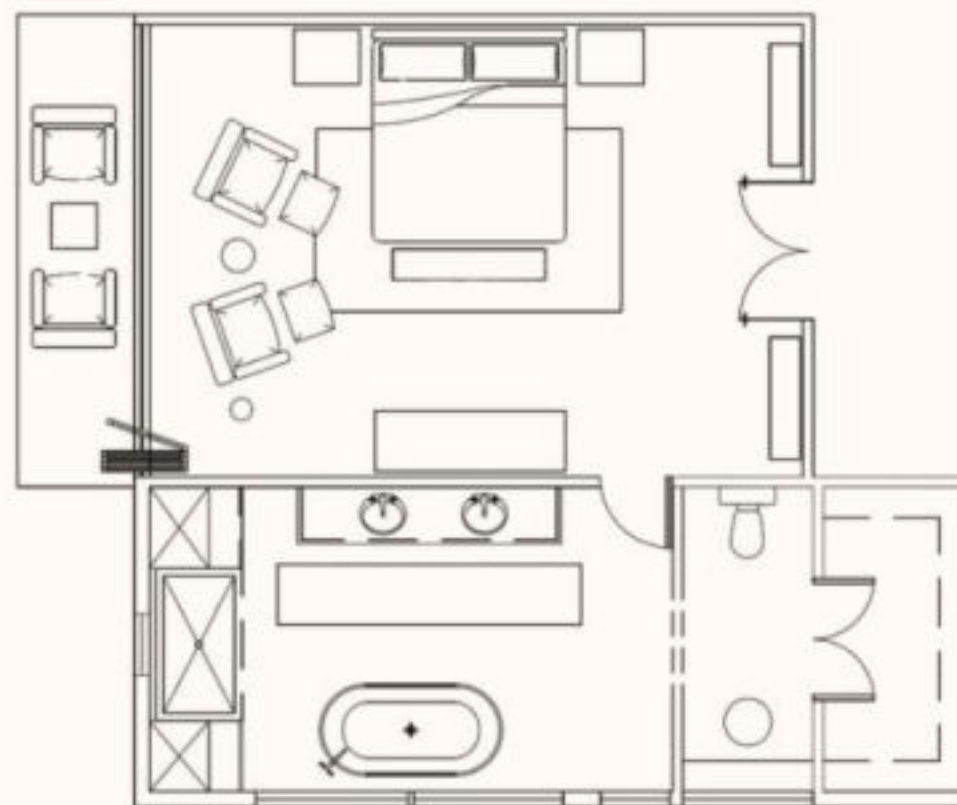
Concept
